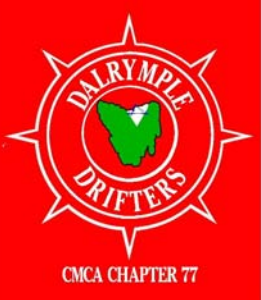


**G'day to you all.**
